## Management Discussion of Fund Performance

### Investment Objective and Strategies

The NBI Unconstrained Fixed Income Fund's investment objective is to maximize total return, consistent with preservation of capital. The Fund invests, directly or indirectly through investments in securities of other mutual funds or through the use of derivatives, in a diversified portfolio composed mainly of fixed income securities of issuers located throughout the world with various maturities and credit ratings.

The portfolio manager seeks to achieve its objective by managing portfolio duration, credit risk, and volatility. The Fund has significant latitude to pursue opportunities across the fixed income spectrum, and is not managed to be compared to any specific index. The Fund has the flexibility to invest across different sectors, credit ratings, maturities and geographic regions, including moving between sectors or across credit risk, and may have long, short or negative duration. The Fund may invest a significant portion of its net assets in a specific type of securities, by weighting one or other of the above criteria more heavily.

### Risks

The global investment risk of the Fund remains as described in the simplified prospectus or any amendments thereto and Fund Facts.

### Results of Operations

For the twelve-month period ended December 31, 2022, the NBI Unconstrained Fixed Income Fund's Investors Series units returned -6.93% compared to -11.53% for the Fund's benchmark, the Bloomberg Global Aggregate Bond Index (CAD Hedged). Unlike the benchmark, the Fund's performance is calculated after fees and expenses. Please see the *Past Performance* section for the returns of all of the Fund's series, which may vary mainly because of fees and expenses.

Certain series of the Fund, as applicable, may make distributions at a rate determined by the manager. This rate may change from time to time. If the aggregate amount of distributions in such series exceeds the portion of net income and net realized capital gains allocated to such series, the excess will constitute a return of capital. The manager does not believe that the return of capital distributions made by such series of the Fund have a meaningful impact on the Fund's ability to implement its investment strategy or to fulfill its investment objective.

The Fund's net asset value dropped by 17.62% over the period, from \$2.388 billion as at December 31, 2021 to \$1.967 billion as at December 31, 2022. The decline stemmed mainly from withdrawals in the Fund by other NBI Funds and market fluctuations.

Geopolitical uncertainty and supply chain disruptions inflicted persistent cost pressures on consumers. In the US, Eurozone, and the UK, inflation remained elevated throughout the period, despite some evidence of a rollover to close out the year, while sustained upside pressure from tight labour markets sparked concerns of a wage-price spiral.

In response, central banks raised policy rates at a historically rapid pace – the Fed delivered 7 incremental increases totaling 425 bps across the year. The ECB and Bank of England followed suit and increased core rates to 2.5% and 3.5% respectively.

As the imperative to tame inflation overcame recession fears in the short term, the global growth outlook deteriorated, despite mixed GDP data and surprisingly resilient private sector balance sheets. Chronically above-target inflation, negative real rates, and a weakening global growth outlook pushed yields higher and drove the worst bond market returns in history: US treasuries returned -12.9%, with investment-grade credit returns of -14.6%. US and European high yield returned -11.2% and -11.3% respectively while emerging market debt returned -17.3%.

The fund saw negative returns, led by exposure to investment-grade corporate credit, given the sensitivity of relatively longer-dated, high-quality bonds to core rate increases. The allocation to high yield detracted, although this was a key area of gradual risk reduction throughout the year as the Fund improved portfolio quality. Emerging market debt underperformed in both hard currency sovereigns and corporates, and local currency bonds, despite a brief rally to end the year. Securitized products were also a minor detractor.

Despite this context, the Fund outperformed its benchmark for the period. Offsetting some of the underperformance was a strong performance from the Fund's government rates positions, where the Fund remained net short government bond duration throughout the period – principally via US Treasuries – as policy rates increased rapidly.

Over the year, the Fund increased its duration from 2.3 to 3.5 years, reducing the short US Treasury positioning and closing the short France government position, while increasing the short German Bund position and opening short Japan and Italy government bond positions. The Fund gradually reduced high-yield credit risk and added CDX protection, bringing exposure from 35% to 23%, while also reducing exposure to securitized products from 16% to 9%. The Fund improved the portfolio quality by gradually adding to investment grade credit, increasing exposure from 26% to 36%. The Fund maintained overall emerging market debt exposure at 15%, primarily by rotating various positions in the portfolio.

### Recent Developments

Led by the Federal Reserve, aggressive developed market central bank rate increases appear to be biting into inflation as energy, goods, and shelter prices moderate.

In the portfolio manager's view, wage growth must decline, and unemployment must rise for the Fed to bring core inflation closer to target levels. Recession is the asset manager base case, given the trailing effect of monetary policy. Further rate increases are expected, but central banks have the worst behind them.

The portfolio manager thinks yields can peak ahead of the final rate rise of this cycle, and investors should target any backup in yields to add high-quality duration favoring government bonds, investment grade corporates, and securitized credit, with selective exposure to local currency emerging market debt.

On April 30, 2022, the Fund's independent review committee (the "IRC") was reduced to three members when Robert Martin resigned as IRC member. On May 1, 2022, the Fund's IRC was increased to four members when Line Deslandes was appointed as IRC member. However, on September 30, 2022, the Fund's IRC was reduced to three members when Line Deslandes resigned as IRC member.

On May 20, 2022, NBI discontinued the purchase offering of deferred sales charge and low sales charge purchase options for all new investments, including purchases made through systematic plans in all Canadian jurisdictions. Investors who purchased units under these sales charge options will continue to be subject to the redemption fee schedules under which they were purchased.

### Related Party Transactions

National Bank of Canada ("the Bank") and its affiliated companies' roles and responsibilities related to the Fund are as follows:

#### Trustee, Custodian, and Registrar

Natcan Trust Company ("NTC"), a direct or indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank, is the Fund's trustee. In this capacity, it is the legal owner of the Fund's investments.

NTC acts as registrar for the Fund's securities and the names of securityholders. NTC also acts as the Fund's custodian. The fees for NTC's custodial services are based on the standard rates in effect at NTC.

### Agent for securities lending transactions

NTC acts as the agent for securities lending transactions acts on behalf of the Fund in administering securities lending transactions entered into by the Fund. NTC is an affiliate of the Manager.

### Fund Manager

The Fund is managed by National Bank Investments Inc. (“NBII”), which is a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank. Therefore, NBII provides or ensures the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund’s current operations, including investment consulting, the arrangement of brokerage contracts for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, bookkeeping and other administrative services required by the Fund.

The Manager pays the operating expenses of the Fund other than its “Fund costs” (defined below) (the “variable operating expenses”), in exchange for the Fund’s payment to the Manager of annual fixed-rate administration fees with respect to each series of the Fund.

The administration fees are equal to a specified percentage of the net asset value of each series of the Fund, calculated and paid in the same manner as the Fund’s management fees. The variable operating expenses payable by the Manager include, but are not limited to: transfer agency and recordkeeping costs; custodial costs; accounting and valuation fees; audit fees and legal fees; costs of preparing and distributing financial reports, simplified prospectuses, annual information forms, Fund Facts, continuous disclosure material and other securityholder communications; and costs of trustee services relating to registered tax plans, as applicable.

In addition to administration fees, the Fund shall also pay certain Fund costs, namely: taxes (including, but not limited to, GST/HST and income taxes); costs of compliance with any changes to existing governmental or regulatory requirements introduced after August 1, 2013; costs of compliance with any new governmental or regulatory requirements, including any new fees introduced after August 1, 2013; interest and borrowing costs; costs related to external services that were not commonly charged in the Canadian mutual fund industry as at August 1, 2013; Independent Review Committee costs, including compensation paid to IRC members, travel expenses, insurance premiums and costs associated with their continuing education; and variable operating expenses incurred outside of the normal course of business of the Fund.

The Manager may, from time to time and at its sole discretion, decide to absorb a portion of a series’ management fees, administration fees or Fund costs.

As described under the heading *Management Fees*, the Fund pays annual management fees to NBII as consideration for its services.

### Portfolio Manager

The Manager has appointed National Bank Trust Inc. (“NBT”), an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank, as the portfolio manager for the Fund. A flat fee is payable annually to NBT for its management services.

### Distribution and Dealer Compensation

NBII acts as principal distributor for the Fund. In this capacity, NBII buys, sells and swaps securities through Bank branches and the National Bank Investments Advisory Service in Canadian provinces and territories, and through external registered representatives. Fund securities are also offered by National Bank Financial Inc. (including its division National Bank Direct Brokerage), CABN Investments (a division of NBII) and other affiliated entities. Brokers may receive, depending on the distributed series, a monthly commission representing a percentage of the average daily value of the securities held by their clients.

### Brokerage Fees

The Fund may pay broker’s commissions at market rates to a corporation affiliated with NBII. The brokerage fees paid by the Fund for the period are as follows:

### Holdings

As at December 31, 2022, National Bank Investments Inc. held 1,135.12 Fund securities for a value of \$9,145.62, which represented close to 0.0005% of the net asset value of the Fund at that date. Transactions between National Bank Investments Inc. and the Fund were carried out in the normal course of business and at the Fund’s net asset value as at the transaction date.

As at December 31, 2022, National Bank Trust Inc. held 1.31 Fund securities for a value of \$10.48, which represented close to 0.0000% of the net asset value of the Fund at that date. Transactions between National Bank Trust Inc. and the Fund were carried out in the normal course of business and at the Fund’s net asset value as at the transaction date.

### Registered Plan Trust Services

NTC receives a fixed amount per registered account for services provided as trustee for registered plans.

### Administrative and Operating Services

The provision of certain services was delegated by the Fund Manager, NBII, to National Bank Trust Inc. (“NBT”), a wholly-owned indirect subsidiary of the Bank. These include accounting, reporting and portfolio valuation services. The fees incurred for these services are paid to NBT by the Fund manager.

### Management Fees

The Fund pays annual management fees to the Fund manager for its management services. As the Fund invests in underlying funds, the fees and expenses payable in connection with the management of the underlying funds are in addition to those payable by the Fund. However, the Fund manager makes sure that the Fund does not pay any management (or operating) fees that, to a reasonable person, would duplicate a fee payable by the underlying fund for the same service.

The fees are calculated based on a percentage of the Fund's daily net asset value before applicable taxes and are paid on a monthly basis. Under the *Distribution* heading, expenses include the broker's compensation consisting of the maximum annual trailer fees and sales commissions paid to brokers. Under the *Other* heading, the fees relate mainly to investment management, investment advisory services, general administration and profit. The breakdown of major services provided in consideration of the management fees, expressed as an approximate percentage of the management fees is as follows:

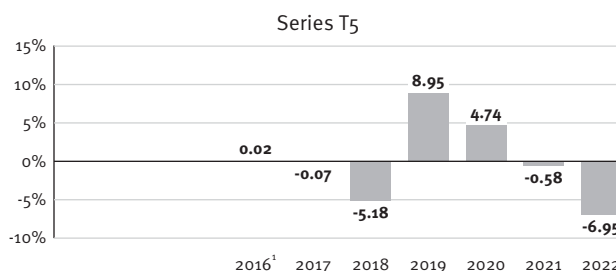

## Past Performance
