Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

The NBI Global Real Assets Income Fund's investment objective is to generate income and long-term capital growth while focusing on hedging against inflation.

The portfolio manager applies a bottom-up approach based on a disciplined valuation of high quality companies, while providing geographic diversification. This approach aims to achieve a balance between high income and opportunities for growth.

Risks

The Fund's risk level was modified from "low to medium" to "medium" during the year. This change aims to more accurately reflect the Fund's actual risk level.

Results of Operations

For the twelve-month period ended December 31, 2020, the NBI Global Real Assets Income Fund's Investor Series units returned -15.36% compared to -7.42% for the Fund's benchmark, the S&P Global Infrastructure Index (CAD). Unlike the benchmark, the Fund's performance is calculated after fees and expenses. Please see the *Past Performance* section for the returns of all of the Fund's series, which may vary mainly because of fees and expenses.

Certain series of the Fund, as applicable, may make distributions at a rate determined by the manager. This rate may change from time to time. If the aggregate amount of distributions in such series exceeds the portion of net income and net realized capital gains allocated to such series, the excess will constitute a return of capital. The manager does not believe that the return of capital distributions made by such series of the Fund have a meaningful impact on the Fund's ability to implement its investment strategy or to fulfill its investment objective.

The Fund's net asset value dropped by 34.35% over the period, from \$648.30 million as at December 31, 2019 to \$425.60 million as at December 31, 2020.

This decline stemmed mainly from withdrawals in the Fund by other NBI Funds and market fluctuations.

2020 was a year unlike any other, complete with wildfires, hurricanes and widespread social unrest. A new U.S. president was elected, and the UK took its final steps to leave the European Union officially. But what defined the year was undoubtedly the COVID-19 pandemic, which almost overnight changed how we lived our daily lives. Furthermore, its impact on global markets and economies cannot be understated; the pandemic gave us a stock market crash, record-setting highs and everything in between. What will 2021 bring? Only time will tell, but the portfolio manager is optimistic about a post-vaccine recovery.

Equity markets performed positively in 2020 despite the global COVID-19 pandemic. Among major benchmarks, the S&P 500 Index led the way, climbing 16.32%. The MSCI Emerging Markets Index followed, rising 16.23%. Finally, the MSCI EAFE Index, a measure of non-U.S. developed markets, increased by 5.92%.

In the U.S., the year began with President Trump's impeachment trial and the discovery of the novel coronavirus and concluded with a vaccine for COVID-19. We witnessed an ongoing trade war between China and the U.S. and countrywide protests over police department reform. In November, Joe Biden won the U.S. presidential election. The U.S. Federal Reserve (the "Fed") took unprecedented action to support the economy in response to the coronavirus pandemic. Following the massive stimulus measures, the Fed held interest rates steady for the remainder of the year. The USD ended the year down.

Among developed markets, Europe saw the coronavirus's rapid spread throughout the continent. The proliferation of the virus resulted in nationwide lockdowns and travel bans in several European countries. The European Central Bank (the "ECB") introduced a bond-buying program at the pandemic's onset to pacify fears and support the economy. The program continued throughout the year and was expanded by 500 million euros in December. The ECB held interest rates steady throughout the period. The Bank of Japan kept rates steady during the period and followed the U.S. and other central banks' lead by expanding its purchases of stocks and bonds to boost its economy.

It was a tumultuous 2020 for the petroleum industry, which endured oil price and oil demand fluctuation throughout the year. Although there were a series of rebounds throughout the period, continually rising COVID-19 cases and the resulting lockdowns led to perpetual weak global oil consumption.

Under these circumstances, the NBI Global Real Assets Income Fund underperformed its benchmark in 2020. Overall, the positioning among the Industrials sector contributed to relative results, while the majority of underperformance was concentrated in Energy and Real Estate.

Recent Developments

Over the course of 2020, the investment team added to European and U.S. Telecommunication infrastructure, while trimming in U.S. Health Care infrastructure and modestly in European Utilities. The portfolio manager believes Telecommunication Infrastructure has seen its importance heightened as a result of the global pandemic and sees this as a favourable tailwind for industry fundamentals. While historically many used their home connectivity primarily for leisure purposes, today, with the emerging work from home economy, home connectivity has become an economic necessity. In addition to this strong push from pandemic related demand, many carriers are now embarking on the 5G rollout, providing another tailwind to the group's fundamentals.

The three main elements of the strategy are income, value and infrastructure. The backdrop in 2020 was severely challenged as income and value as styles dramatically underperformed high valuation and low-income characteristics. Given its weighting to transportation, infrastructure as an asset class was also quite challenged this year given the lockdown nature of the pandemic.

Equity markets closed out 2020 near record highs, buoyed by the COVID-19 vaccine rollout and a decided U.S. presidential election. The portfolio manager believes the stage is set for an environment that includes continued stimulus efforts and supportive monetary policy. Although the infrastructure asset class participated in the broad equity market rally in the fourth quarter, it ultimately could not recoup the drawdown from the first quarter of 2020 and finished the year lower. Due to the pandemic, assets that have historically been very defensive during recessions, such as airports, seaports and toll roads, were hit hard during the year, along with end demand for energy infrastructure. With the vaccine distribution set to catalyze a broad global economic reopening, these businesses will reaccelerate toward normalized levels. Ongoing capital investment in renewable energy projects tied to the energy transition theme is also a key tailwind to an improved environment for the asset class as well.

On April 30, 2020, the Fund's independent review committee (the "IRC") was reduced to three members when Jacques Valotaire and Jean-François Bernier resigned as IRC members. On July 1, 2020, the Fund's IRC was increased to four members when Marie Desroches was appointed as IRC member.

Related Party Transactions

National Bank of Canada ("the Bank") and its affiliated companies' roles and responsibilities related to the Fund are as follows:

Trustee, Custodian, and Registrar

Natcan Trust Company ("NTC"), a direct or indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank, is the Fund's trustee. In this capacity, it is the legal owner of the Fund's investments.

NTC acts as registrar for the Fund's securities and the names of securityholders. NTC also acts as the Fund's custodian. The fees for NTC's custodial services are based on the standard rates in effect at NTC.

Agent for securities lending transactions

NTC acts as the agent for securities lending transactions acts on behalf of the Fund in administering securities lending transactions entered into by the Fund. NTC is an affiliate of the Manager.

Fund Manager

The Fund is managed by National Bank Investments Inc. ("NBII"), which is a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank. Therefore, NBII provides or ensures the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund's current operations, including investment consulting, the arrangement of brokerage contracts for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, bookkeeping and other administrative services required by the Fund.

The Manager pays the operating expenses of the Fund other than its "Fund costs" (defined below) (the "variable operating expenses"), in exchange for the Fund's payment to the Manager of annual fixed-rate administration fees with respect to each series of the Fund.

The administration fees are equal to a specified percentage of the net asset value of each series of the Fund, calculated and paid in the same manner as the Fund's management fees. The variable operating expenses payable by the Manager include, but are not limited to: transfer agency and recordkeeping costs; custodial costs; accounting and valuation fees; audit fees and legal fees; costs of preparing and distributing financial reports, simplified prospectuses, annual information forms, Fund Facts, continuous disclosure material and other securityholder communications; and costs of trustee services relating to registered tax plans, as applicable.

In addition to administration fees, the Fund shall also pay certain Fund costs, namely: taxes (including, but not limited to, GST/HST and income taxes); costs of compliance with any changes to existing governmental or regulatory requirements introduced after August 1, 2013; costs of compliance with any new governmental or regulatory requirements, including any new fees introduced after August 1, 2013; interest and borrowing costs; costs related to external services that were not commonly charged in the Canadian mutual fund industry as at August 1, 2013; Independent Review Committee costs, including compensation paid to IRC members, travel expenses, insurance premiums and costs associated with their continuing education; and variable operating expenses incurred outside of the normal course of business of the Fund.

The Manager may, from time to time and at its sole discretion, decide to absorb a portion of a series' management fees, administration fees or Fund costs.

As described under the heading *Management Fees*, the Fund pays annual management fees to NBII as consideration for its services.

Distribution and Dealer Compensation

NBII acts as principal distributor for the Fund. In this capacity, NBII buys, sells and swaps securities through Bank branches and the National Bank Investments Advisory Service in Canadian provinces and territories, and through external registered representatives. Fund securities are also offered by National Bank Financial Inc. (including its division National Bank Direct Brokerage), CABN Investments (a division of NBII) and other affiliated entities. Brokers may receive, depending on the distributed series, a monthly commission representing a percentage of the average daily value of the securities held by their clients.

Brokerage Fees

The Fund may pay broker's commissions at market rates to a corporation affiliated with NBII. The brokerage fees paid by the Fund for the period are as follows:

Holdings

As at December 31, 2020, National Bank Investments Inc. held 17,294.34 Fund securities for a value of \$157,432.97, which represented close to 0.0366% of the net asset value of the Fund at that date. Transactions between National Bank Investments Inc. and the Fund were carried out in the normal course of business and at the Fund's net asset value as at the transaction date.

As at December 31, 2020, National Bank Trust Inc. held 1.18 Fund securities for a value of \$9.80, which represented close to 0.0000% of the net asset value of the Fund at that date. Transactions between National Bank Trust Inc. and the Fund were carried out in the normal course of business and at the Fund's net asset value as at the transaction date.

Registered Plan Trust Services

NTC receives a fixed amount per registered account for services provided as trustee for registered plans.

Administrative and Operating Services

The provision of certain services was delegated by the Fund Manager, NBII, to National Bank Trust Inc. ("NBT"), a wholly-owned indirect subsidiary of the Bank. These include accounting, reporting and portfolio valuation services. The fees incurred for these services are paid to NBT by the Fund manager.

Management Fees

The Fund pays annual management fees to the Fund manager for its management services. The fees are calculated based on a percentage of the Fund's daily net asset value before applicable taxes and are paid on a monthly basis. A portion of the management fees paid by the Fund covers maximum annual trailer fees and sales commissions paid to brokers. The remainder of the management fees primarily covers investment management and general administration services. The breakdown of major services provided in consideration of the management fees, expressed as an approximate percentage of the management fees is as follows:

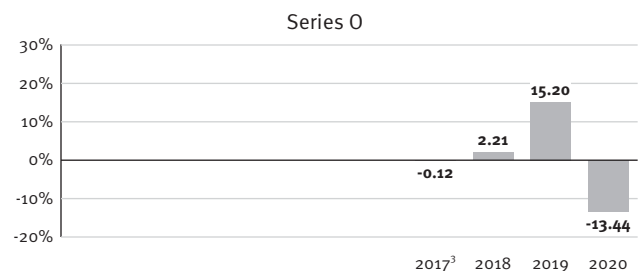

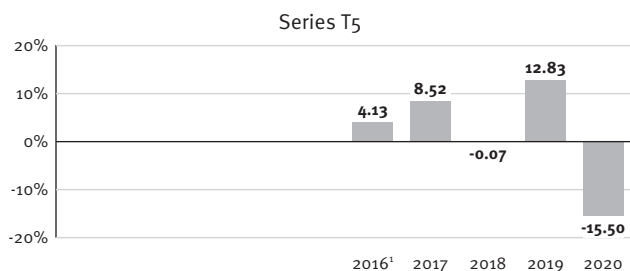
Past Performance
